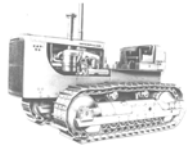
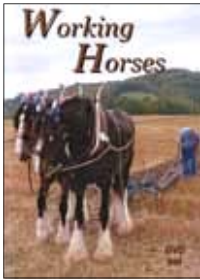

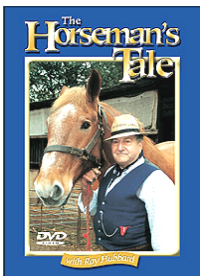


## WORKING HORSES

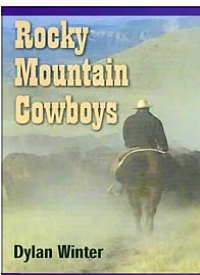


## THE HORSEMAN'S TALE

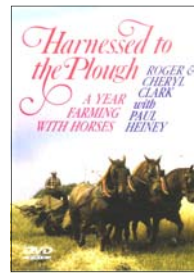


## ROCKY MOUNTAIN COWBOYS

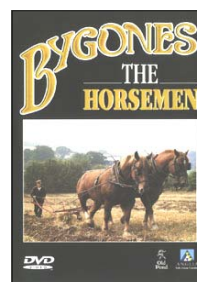
## FIRST STEPS TO THE FURROW

## BYGONES THE HORSEMEN

At the turn of the century the work of the farm revolved around the farm horse. In 1975 the Anglia Bygones team filmed some remarkable men in their eighties and nineties who had worked with farm horses from before the First World War. The regularity of the horseman's day, the high standards of workmanship, the secrets of ointments and horse lore-they talked about it all, and the Bygones team re-created their working lives. They showed ploughing, drilling, rolling, haymaking and harvest, as well as the farrier and the travelling stallion. The 1914-18 war was the point at which this way of work began to change, with so many horses commandeered for army haulage and the first inroads made by the farm tractor.

Based on research by George Ewart Evans, this 'Bygones Special' is a memorable and accurate record of a past age

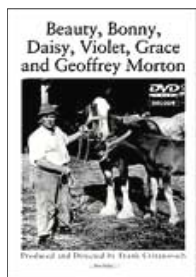

## BEAUTY, BONNY, DAISY, VIOLET, GRACE AND GEOFFREY MORTON

Originally broadcast by Thames Television in 1974, this 'grave and beautiful film' (Daily Telegraph) looked at a year in the life of the Yorkshire farmer Geoffrey Morton and his farm horses.



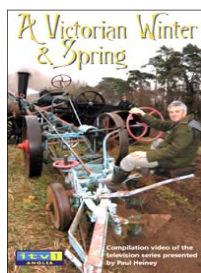
Geoffrey chooses a stallion at the Shire Horse Show and puts him to a mare. The birth of a foal is movingly captured and other scenes show how the horses were used on the farm and in the woodland. Throughout the DVD Geoffrey talks about his way of life and how he believed that working horses had a part to play in farming.

The film-maker Frank Cvitanovich was described in the Independent as 'one of the finest and most personal documentary-makers of his time'. This DVD was one of his masterpieces – an intimate portrait of a remarkable farmer that went on to win a Bafta award & the Prix Italia for documentaries.

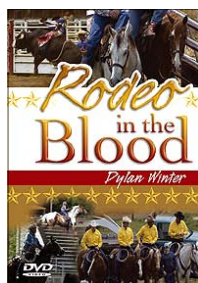
## A VICTORIAN SUMMER

## RODEO IN THE BLOOD

Join Dylan Winter on his quest across America and Canada to discover why perfectly ordinary young men hunker down on the back of a bull and try to stay there for eight seconds – the longest eight seconds in the world.

On the way you'll experience almost every element of the rodeo way of life. It starts young, with thrill-seeking infants in the 'pee-wee goat tying' events and very juvenile 'mutton-busters'. Then there's superb riding by young women in the pole-bending and barrel-racing competitions. Trials for real cowboys include team sorting, penning and loading as well as a lot of throwing and tying. The Big Man event – steer wrestling – isn't for the faint-hearted.

Bare-back riding, saddle riding and the most dangerous sport in the world - bull riding - provide thrilling finales. Dylan's interviews with riders, breeders and rodeo families get to the source of the bull-rider's motivation – it's in the blood.

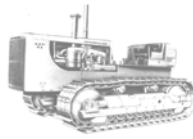
